## 2012 IAPA Academician Awardee: Dr. K.N. Roy Chengappa

The IAPA is proud to honor Dr. K.N. Roy Chengappa, MD, with Academician of the year Award for his outstanding academic and scientific contributions to the field of Psychiatry. Dr. Chengappa is a Professor of Psychiatry at the University Of Pittsburgh School Of Medicine and the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic, and is Chief of Comprehensive Recovery Services at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic, located in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Dr Chengappa grew up in India; he was schooled at the Lawrence School, Lovedale, and graduated in medicine from Kasturba Medical College, Manipal. His training in psychiatry occurred world-wide, beginning at the National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences,

Bangalore, and then at the University of Edinburgh, Scotland, and at Dalhousie University in Halifax, Canada. He undertook an NIMH-sponsored fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh investigating autoimmune mechanisms in persons with schizophrenia under the tutelage of Drs. Rohan Ganguli and Bruce Rabin before accepting a faculty position there. He has direct patient care responsibilities and is involved in the mentoring of psychiatric residents and medical students.

For 22 years, he has conducted clinical trials of antipsychotic and anticonvulsant agents in patients with schizophrenia, schizoaffective or bipolar disorder. In recent years, he has begun investigations into the use of natural substances such as Inositol for bipolar depression and L-Carnosine and Ashwagandha as potential cognition enhancing agents in people with mental illnesses. He has extensively published the results of his research in numerous peer-reviewed journals and also serves as Co-Editor in Chief of the journal *Bipolar Disorders*. Dr Chengappa is a recipient of several awards including Faculty Honoree, Honors Convocation, University of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Rev. C. Leroy Hacker Ambassador Award, Mayview State Hospital, Pennsylvania. IAPA heartily applauds Dr, Chengappa's achievements and wishes him success in his future endeavors.



## 2012 APA/Lilly Resident Research Award: Dr.Suraj Pal Singh

Dr Suraj Pal Singh is a third year psychiatry Resident at the Medical College of Wisconsin, Milwaukee and graduated from the Government Medical College, Patiala, in India. He took the route into psychiatry residency in USA after training in Internal Medicine in UK, then completing his psychiatry training and obtaining the membership of Royal College of Psychiatrists, UK .He further secured a higher specialist training post there and was appointed an Honorary lecturer in West Midlands School of psychiatry prior to moving to USA.
