IAPA Silver Jubilee Celebrations on May 2

New York is the place to be on Sunday, May 2 as the Indo American Psychiatric Association celebrates its Silver Jubilee (25^{th} anniversary) in a grand manner. The founding chapter of IAPA, the New York chapter, is making an all-out effort to make this a memorable annual meeting.

As usual, there will be two sessions of the annual meeting. On the afternoon of May 2, the Scientific Session will be held. Dr. Shitij Kapur, winner of this year's IAPA Outstanding Academician Award, will speak on the exciting topic, *Linking the phenomenology, psychology and pharmacology of psychosis: a feasible project or a delusion?*

Born Confused? A Symposium

Dr. Kapur's lecture will be followed by a symposium chaired by Dr. Salman Akhtar exploring the myths and realities of that oft repeated moniker, *Born Confused*. Participating in this symposium are Dr. Madhulika Khandelwal, author of Becoming American, *Being Indian*; S. Kalita Mitra, author of *Suburban Sahibs*; and Ruth Ann Van Renken, author of *Third Culture Kids*.

Dr. Van Garners 33.5% of Votes in the APA Elections

He is an international medical graduate with a long and difficult to pronounce name. He was contesting an election for the first time while his opponent was running his fifth election campaign in the APA. He never held an elected office in the American Psychiatric Association (APA) and was an outsider whereas his opponent is the incumbent vice-president of the APA. He did not plan on this election until the APA's Nominating Committee approached him at the last minute.



Despite all these obstacles, Dr. Jagannathan Srinivasaraghavan (Dr. Van), former president of the IAPA and the first Indian psychiatrist to run for the office of the President-Elect of the American Psychiatric Association, did us all proud by securing 3,105 votes (33.5%) of the 9,275 votes cast in the elections this year. The APA Committee of Tellers announced Dr. Steven Sharfstein as the winner in this election.

Dr. Van's achievement can be better understood when considered in the light of the results of the recent APA elections. Dr. Van's share of the vote is similar to that of well orchestrated campaigns of heavyweights like Drs. Sam Guze and Sid Weissman in the recent presidential elections and better than some other recent presidential candidates. The numbers demonstrate that his support went beyond just the Indian or other international medical graduates.



IAPA Announces 2004 Excellence Awards

Dr. Shitij Kapur

Outstanding Academician Award

This year's IAPA Outstanding Academician Award will be presented to Dr. Shitij Kapur, MD, FRCPC, PhD, currently the Canada Research Chair for Schizophrenia and Therapeutic Neuroscience, Vice-President for Research at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, and a Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Toronto. Dr. Kapur graduated from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, did his psychiatric training at the University of Pittsburgh - where he developed an interest in the biology of schizophrenia. He subsequently completed a PhD and Fellowship at the University of Toronto and his main research interest is in the use of brain imaging and animal models to understand the basis of psychosis and its treatment.



In the last few years, Dr. Kapur along with his colleagues Drs. Remington, Zipursky, Houle, Wilson and Seeman has focused on the study of the role of the brain receptors and neurotransmitters, particularly dopamine and serotonin, and their role in schizophrenia and antipsychotic action. This work has shown that all antipsychotics (typical and atypical) block dopamine D₂ receptors in patients, though to different degrees - and that these differences are clinically very meaningful. Dr. Kapur has also been collaborating with Drs. Fletcher, Fleming and Nobrega, focusing on how animal models can be used to derive more innovative treatments for Schizophrenia - and this work has pointed to the

central importance of 'sensitization' as a key to Schizophrenia. His latest work arises from an effort to link the "biological" and "pharmacological" aspects of this illness to its "phenomenological" experience.

When away from his desk, Dr. Kapur is usually ferrying his young children from one educational or sporting activity to another. Both Shitij and Sharmista, his wife and a Professor of Business, love to travel. When feeling overwhelmed by work and family responsibilities, Dr. Kapur is also prone to disappear on camping expeditions into the icy wilderness of northern Canada.

Dr. Nyapathi Rao

IAPA Service Award

This year's IAPA Service Award will be presented to Dr. Nyapathi Rao, Director of Residency Training at Downstate University Medical Center, New York. IAPA members would recall that Dr. Rao, who held many important positions in American Association of Directors of Psychiatric Residency Training (AADPRT) and American Psychiatric Association including its mentoring program, has served as the Editor of *Forum* between 1998 and 2000.

Dr. Janakibai Theogoraj

Outstanding Service to Public Psychiatry Award

The newly instituted Award for Outstanding Service to Public Psychaitry will be presented to Dr. Janakibai Theogoraj, Director of the Substance Abuse Treatment Pro-

gram, McGuire VA Medical Center, Richmond, VA.

Dr. Theogaraj is a life member of IAPA and is a familiar presence at its meetings at the national and state levels. Dr. Theogaraj obtained her basic medical training from the University of Madras and completed her residency training in psychiatry at the Medical College of Virginia in 1978 and further obtained Fellowship training in Child Psychia-



try at the Virginia Treatment Center for Children, Medical College of Virginia. She is board certified in Psychiatry and also holds the American Society of Addiction Medicine certification in Addiction Medicine.

Over the last 20 years, she has received several awards and recognitions. In 1995, she was the recipient of the Nancy CA Roeske certificate for excellence for her contribution to medical education. She has volunteered a significant amount of her time for the activities of the IAPA Virginia chapter through mentoring early career psychiatrists and encouraging psychiatry residents to become active members. She has also mentored generations of counselors and has been responsible for the certification of numerous persons as substance abuse counselors in the state of Virginia through the Old Dominion University Certificate Program.

Dr. Theogaraj is a Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and has been an active member since 1976. She served on the APA Committee on Medical Student Education. She is also a longstanding member of

the American Society of Addiction Medicine and the Women's Physician Association and has served in several committees at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center and the Medical College of Virginia.

Dr. Theogaraj has given her time and expertise to community based activities. She has provided education to children at several local middle schools and high schools regarding mental illness and substance abuse. She was involved in education of the general public and veterans, as a member of the Suicide and Violence Committee, sponsored by the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond, VA. She played a key role in organizing a transitional home for the homeless veterans. in collaboration with the local shelter programs such as CARITAS. She has been an active participant in raising support for the families of 9/11, and the American Cancer Society. As a member of the Christian Medical Association she has arranged monetary and other support to medical colleges in India, including materials needed for surgery and operation theatres for over 20 years.

Outside of her professional interests she has great appreciation for the Arts. She is the voice for the Indian community as a member of the committee to support Asian Art exhibitions at the Virginia Museum in Richmond. Dr. Theogaraj has excelled in multiple fields, both professional and non professional and has an impressive record of service.

Dr. Kumar Budur

Outstanding Psychiatric Resident Award

This year's Award for Outstanding Psychiatric Resident of Indian Origin will be presented to Dr. Kumar Budur, a PGY-III resident at the Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Budur graduated from Vijayanagara Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary, India in 1996. He was awarded "The Best Outgoing Student" from his medical school. He then pursued post graduate train-

ing in UK for 3-1/2 years in clinical psychiatry. He received a Diploma in Clinical Psychiatry in Ireland in May 2003 and will be completing the final part of the Royal College of Psychiatrists Examination in April 2004.

Dr. Budur is elected to be one of the chief residents for 2003-04 at the Cleveland Clinic. Over past two years, he has been involved in medical student teaching and was a member of the committee that prepared the curriculum for medical students rotating through psychiatry. He has been a mentor and an excellent role model for junior residents according to his program director.

Dr. Budur has been involved in a number of research projects in the Department of Psychiatry and Neurology and has published several papers over the past two and half years. He is currently working on two research projects including psychiatric manifestations in patients with mitochondrial disorders, and the prevalence of psychiatry disorders following brain surgery. He is also co-authoring a book titled "MCQ's for the Boards" expected to be published in June of this year.

Dr. Budur has been recruited to do a Fellowship Program in Sleep Medicine at the Cleveland Clinic. He plans to return to India to take position in a teaching hospital after finishing his psychiatric training.

Dr. Prakash N. Desai

Distinguished Recognition Award

Dr. Prakash Desai, Professor of Psychiatry and Associate Dean at the College of Medicine, University of Illinois, Chicago, Chief of Staff at VA Chicago Healthcare System, and the Speaker of the Assembly of the American Psychiatric Association will be honored with a special Distinguished Recognition Award.

Dr. Desai received his medical degree from the University of Baroda, India, in 1962 and completed his psychiatric residency at Northwestern University Medical School in 1967. He holds professional memberships in numerous medical societies and has been the recipient of many grants and awards. Dr. Desai has the distinction of receiving two major awards from the American Psychiatric Association: the Oskar Pfister Award for 1995 for his important contributions to the humanistic and spiritual side of psychiatric and medical issues and the George Tarzan Award in 2003 given annually to an international graduate who has made the most significant contribution to American society. Other awards include the Brice Boyer 1987 Award from the Society for Psychological Anthropology.

Dr. Desai served the APA in several positions including the Recorder of the Assembly and as the Speaker-elect. His election as Speaker of the APA Assembly represents the highest position held by an Indian psychiatrist in the association. Other positions held by him include being the President of National Association of VA Chiefs of Psychiatry (92-93) and the President of American Association of South Asian Psychiatrists (77-79). He has been a member of several important committees and taskforces dealing with mental health law and public psychiatry.



His listing of publications is extensive and includes three books, *Triumph and Tragedy: Psychohistorical Decisions of Mahatma Gandhi, Health and Medicine in the Hindu Tradition,* and *Selfhood and Context – Some Indian Solutions.* Dr. Desai continues to participate actively in the provision of psychiatric services. He has been associated with IAPA since its early days.



North Texas Chapter involves the community in its efforts to provide mental health assistance

The first meeting of the North Texas IAPA was conducted in April 2000 and they have been meeting twice a year since then.

They organized several CME meetings which were well attended. At one of the meetings, high school and college students participating in the discussions indicated the need for better child/parent involvement and participation to spread the information as a means of education. Suggestions made by the youth included support system among our population from peer pressure at schools and colleges. They discussed family pressures by parents to their children to become professionals like themselves, the stigma of discussing mental illness in our community, and need for counseling for incoming international students. They suggested setting up discussion sessions with parents to raise the awareness about mental health, chemical dependence, failure in school and failure in relationships.

The chapter is planning to have more psychiatrists participate at voluntary clinics in association with the Texas Indo Physician Society, to educate and inform the Indian community of treatment facilities available in the area and motivate people to seek help. Radio talks shows by the IAPA psychiatrists about mental problems is an additional source of education. The chapter has been involving the local Lions club and Rotary clubs, and presidents of Indian Associations at the regional universities and colleges to encourage helping those in need of mental health assistance.
